Unfortunately, even in our mountain paradise, we have to contend with noxious weeds. Whether beautiful or ugly, these bullies are rapidly destroying our ecosystems. They push

their way in; taking native plant habitat, reducing wildlife forage and decreasing water supply. They may come in as



seeds from ornamental planning mixes, nursery stock, or by hitch-hiking on vehicles. Noxious weeds thrive because they have no natural controls and can adapt to diverse climate conditions. Additionally, Gilpin County has an ordinance against noxious weeds.






